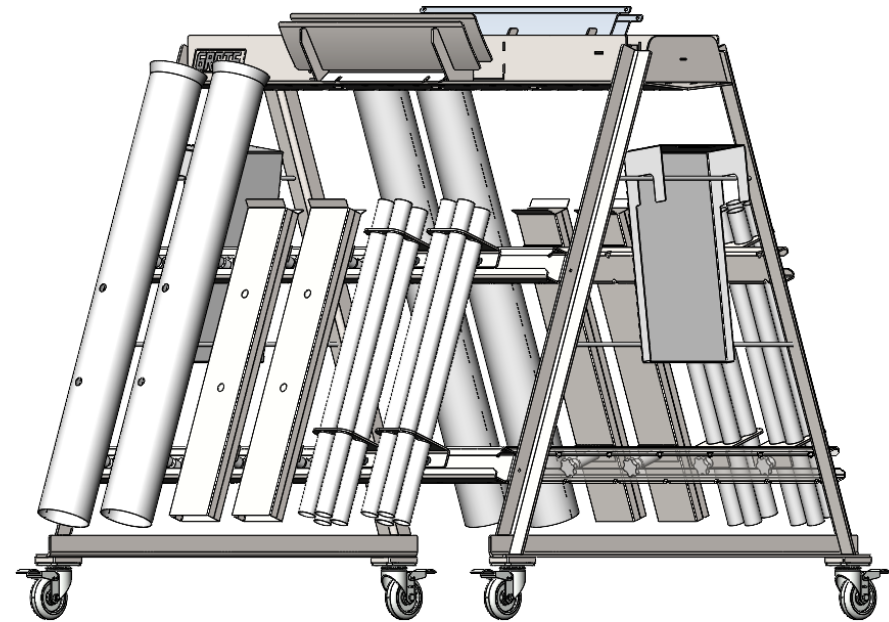

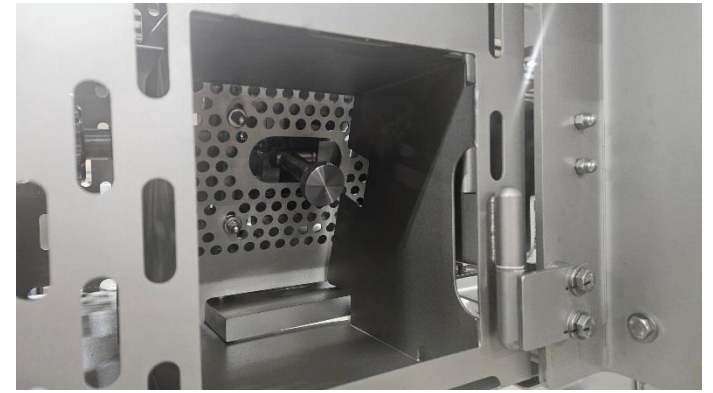
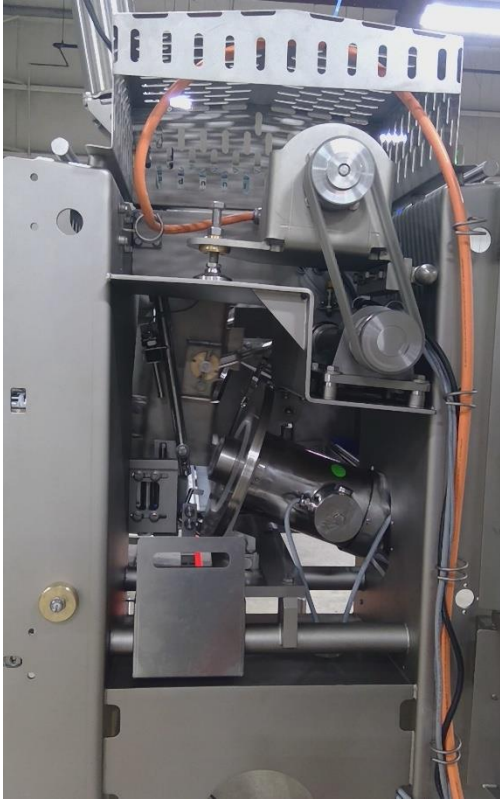

Best – New Equipment Improvements: Accessibility



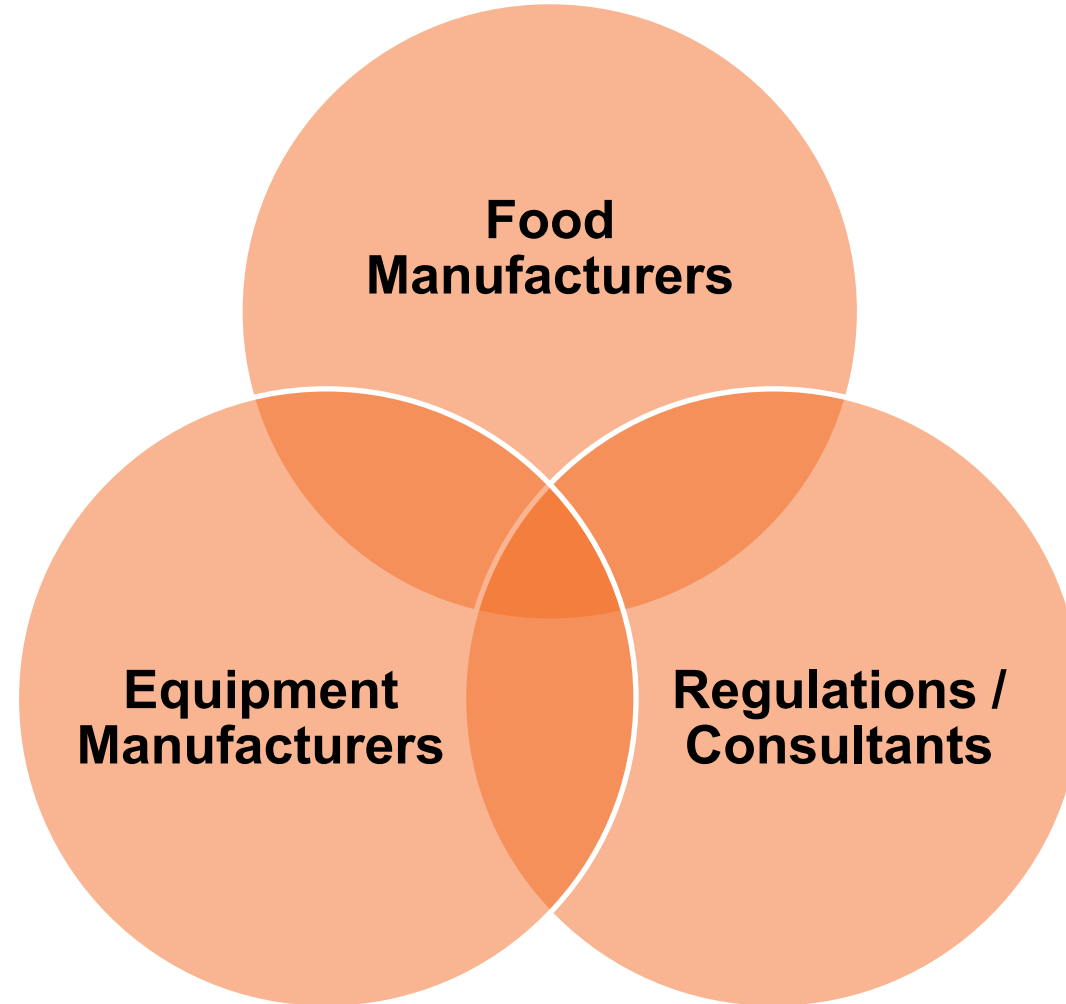
Best – New Equipment Improvements: Drive/Idle Side
